The winners are ...

David Fassler wanted contemporary design, open spaces and a flexible floor plan... The home he took over in midconstruction took first place in the singlefamily, over-2,600 square feet category. The house, in a new Shelburne neighborhood, was designed by Robert Morin of Rhode Island and built by Brian Vorse of DBA/Vorse Construction & Design of Underhill. Vorse describes the layout with great enthusiasm: "All the interior partitions are laid out at a 45 degree angle to the outside building lines. This means you can stand several places in the house and see through to the other end." The gray clapboard house features a third-floor sleeping loft, Eurostyle kitchen, Palladian window with barrelvault ceiling, three-zone oil hot-water heat and two fireplaces.

"There are enough conventional houses out there. This house has lots of volume," Vorse said.

They have streamlined throats to eliminate turbulence and carry away the smoke with little loss of heated room air.
